

Colour Palette

The colour palette – guidelines for personal and social development – is intended to support Hanze UAS schools, degree programmes and lecturers in teaching personal and social development (PSD). PSD is not an off-the-rack product; it must always be tailored to the teachers and the students.

The Colors

- Red stands for the ‘self’ that regards and grows to understand itself.
- Orange is the color of critical thinking;
- Yellow is the color of imagination;
- Green is aimed at development of the moral compass;
- Blue is the color of a sense of community, of the ‘self’ in relation to the other;
- Purple is aimed at the individual and his or her place and role within the greater community;
- Violet is the color of heritage, of the reservoir of backgrounds and principles that have made society and the world what they are;
- Finally, grey has been added because PSD in education will always require practice as well.
